



A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Our Parish Penance Service will be held this Wednesday evening at 7:00 p.m. We will have a very brief prayer service and then many priests here to hear confessions. If you haven't yet been to confession during Lent, this is a great opportunity.

Next weekend, is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. Palms will be distributed at all Masses and we will read the Passion story from the Gospel of Mark. If the weather cooperates, we will have an outdoor procession at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. We will distribute palms and offer opening prayers in the grassy area next to the school loading dock at 11:00 a.m. and then process into the church singing our Hosannas.

As we are approaching Holy Week, I offer words about what is to come. The greatest liturgy of the Church begins on Holy Thursday evening, March 28, at 7:00 p.m. We will read the story of the Last Supper and wash feet of parishioners as we remember Jesus' great act of humility and service. In an outdoor procession, we will take the Blessed Sacrament to the chapel for adoration until 11:00 p.m., and then it will be removed from the church. On Good Friday, we will read the Passion according to John in a solemn service at 12:30 p.m., remembering Jesus' time on the cross. Then, on Holy Saturday, we will return for the great Easter Vigil at 9:00 p.m. An Easter fire will be blessed along with our new Easter candle. The Exsultet will be sung in a dark church by the light of the Easter candle. After hearing the story of an empty tomb, five adults will be Baptized, Confirmed, and receive their First Holy Communion. Masses will be celebrated on Easter Sunday at 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., and also at 5:00 p.m. We will renew our baptismal vows and be sprinkled with blessed water as we remember that we have been baptized in the faith of the Risen Christ.

Again this year local schools have Spring Break which will overlap with our most sacred days of prayer. While many families will be out of town during these holy days, all of us need to keep these days holy. For those who travel, I point out that there are Catholic Churches celebrating these liturgies anywhere you may go. A week at a beach or visiting relatives is a good opportunity, but our faith is too important to neglect during these holy days.

We were honored to have Fr. Herb Weber with us last week to talk about Catholic Relief Service and Operation Rice Bowl. You can find more information or make a donation on the website CRS.org.

Ave Maria House passed the word that they are looking for volunteers. Ave Maria House is a daytime refuge for those who are homeless, located across the street from St. Mary's Parish. People come for showers, laundry facilities, and a place to make connections. At the Easter Masses, the ALLELUIA resounds as we gather to thank God for redeeming us through his Son's death and resurrection. We will renew our baptismal promises at all Masses.

Paschal Watch

St. Charles is again going to celebrate the Paschal Watch. The Church will remain open from after the Holy Thursday Mass until before the Holy Saturday Mass. Just as Jesus asked the apostles in the Scriptures "can you not watch one hour with me," He is now asking each of us the same questions.


**Beauty Will Save the World
