#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Our Parish Penance Service will be held this Wednesday evening at 7:00 p.m. After a very brief prayer service, we will have eight or nine priests available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If you have been away from the sacrament for a long time, this is the perfect opportunity to choose a priest you

know or to choose a priest you don't know. We will have confession guides available; if you don't remember the prayers or the format, that won't be a problem. At each priest station, you will have the option of sitting in a chair in which you see the priest face-to-face or sitting behind a screen where you don't see one another. This sacrament is our best preparation for Easter, and we are only two weeks away!

Holy Week begins next weekend with Palm Sunday. We will distribute palms and have the full reading of the Passion at all Masses. Our solemn procession will take place at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. If the weather cooperates, we will gather on the grassy area next to the Hession Center for the reading of the Opening Gospel and then process in to the church with our palms, singing Hosannas along with the children of Jerusalem.

I offer in advance some encouragement to take part in our great Holy Week liturgies. The Chrism Mass will be held at the Cathedral on Tuesday evening, April 4, at 7:00 p.m. This is a beautiful solemn liturgy in which holy oils are blessed and the priests of the diocese renew their vows. Here at St. Charles, our Holy Thursday Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. on April 6. Our Good Friday liturgy is scheduled at 12:30 p.m. It will be followed by a dramatic production of the Stations of the Cross at 3:00 p.m. presented by a Latino group from St. Patrick's. Our usual parish Stations will be offered at 7:30 p.m. on Good Friday. The solemn Easter Vigil Mass will begin at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday evening, April 8. On Easter Sunday, we have our usual Mass schedule: 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. (Spread the word of our Sunday evening Mass; very few parishes have a Mass at that time and it is a blessing for hospital workers and those who can't come on Sunday morning). For those who will be traveling south on Spring Break vacations, please don't forget Holy Week. This is our most sacred time of prayer. There are Catholic Churches available in Florida.

Redeemer Radio has asked me to be the Priest and host for pilgrimage to the Holy Land in October. I have never been there and I'm excited to visit the places where Jesus lived and to pray in the places so central to our faith. I don't think that the itinerary is finalized yet, but I believe that our group will have Masses at Churches built over the holiest sites in his life: the Place of the Annunciation in Nazareth, the Place of his Birth in Bethlehem, the Place of his Agony in Gethsemane, and the Church built on the Site of his Cross and Tomb. 

#### **Eucharistic Reflection for March – Conversion.**

"At Mass, we say: 'Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.' Venial sins damage but do not destroy our communion with God and the Church. Reception of the Eucharist strengthens our charity and wipes away venial sins, while helping us to avoid serious sins. Mortal sins do rupture our communion with God and the Church. One commits a mortal sin by freely, knowingly, and willingly choosing to do something that involves grave matter and that is opposed to love of God and neighbor. A person in the state or mortal sin is not to receive Holy Communion without having received the Sacrament of Reconciliation. One who receives Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin does not receive the grace of the sacrament, but instead commits the sin of sacrilege by failing to show the reverence due our Eucharistic Lord. #### **Paschal Watch**

St. Charles is again going to celebrate the Paschal Watch. The Church will remain open from after the Holy Thursday Mass until before the Holy Saturday Mass. Just as Jesus asked the apostles in the Scriptures "can you not watch one hour with me," He is now asking each of us the same questions.



Sheets are located in the rear of Church for you to sign up to spend some time with Jesus.



Holy Week begins with the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. We acclaim Him as King as we hold the blessed palms. We then take the palm branches to our homes and put them in a prominent place.

Below is a schedule of Liturgical and Para-Liturgical celebrations for Holy Week:

#### April 2 - PALM SUNDAY

There will be a blessing of palms at the beginning of each Mass. For the 11:00 a.m. Mass, (weather permitting) we will gather outside of the Hession Center for the blessing of palms and a solemn procession into the Church.

This Mass commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Priesthood. We are reminded of Christ's great love for us as He gives His life-giving Body and Blood. After Mass, parishioners are encouraged to spend some time in the quiet church (No Adoration) until 9:00 p.m. on Saturday—Paschal Watch. Remain in Church in quiet prayer.

At the Easter Masses, the ALLELUIA resounds as we gather to thank God for redeeming us through his Son's death and resurrection. We will renew our baptismal promises at all Masses.

The **Annual Chrism Masses** will be held at Saint Matthew Cathedral in South Bend on Monday, April 3, at 7:00 p.m.; and at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Fort Wayne on Tuesday, April 4, at 7:00 p.m. Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades has invited all priests, sisters, brothers, deacons and lay people of the diocese to attend either of these Masses. An interpreter will be present for those who are hearing impaired or deaf. At the Chrism Mass, the Holy Chrism is consecrated and the Oil of Catechumens and Oil of the Sick are blessed. This beautiful Mass manifests the communion of the priests with their bishop in the same priesthood and ministry of Christ.






