

We welcome them into our Church family and we thank the Lord for leading them here. We are also grateful to Casey Ryan, who


leads our parish RCIA. If anyone may be interested in joining the Catholic Church, or just learning more, call the Parish Office and ask for Casey.

We thank everyone who made a gift to Redeemer Radio during last week's Sharathon. I haven't heard numbers yet, but I know that our parish responded with generosity.

We are grateful to our neighboring parishes as they have welcomed us to their churches for funerals during our renovation. Since the renovation began, we have celebrated St. Charles funerals at St. Jude, St. John, New Haven, and the Cathedral. As a precaution, in case the renovation isn't done on time, we have also reserved neighboring churches as a backup for our weddings scheduled in late spring and early summer. We are grateful for helpful neighboring parishes.

As expected, gym Masses present challenges. One of the challenges is the distraction of traffic to and from restrooms during Mass. We are trying to help with this by opening the hallway door in the lobby. Folks can now exit the gym and go to a restroom down the hallway. This should be a little quieter and more discreet. Another great challenge in the gym faces our young parents with babies. We have no cry room, nor do we have a Gathering Space with glass doors and speakers, nor do we have a quick and easy exit when a baby begins to cry. When a baby becomes very loud, the best option parents have is to clunk down the wooden bleachers and go to the lobby, where they can't see or hear much of the Mass. As we all feel for our young parents, I encourage them not to give up. Our little ones belong here. We look forward to the day that we will have a church again and options are easier.

Renovation Week 12: The project is moving quickly and the excitement is mounting. Our altar is now covered in marble, and it is beautiful. Today's photo shows workers placing the pelican on the front of the altar. The marble is laid out for the back wall of the sanctuary and ready to be installed. We can see the beauty of the colors and patterns of the stonework. Around the periphery of the church, the suspended ceiling and lights are going in. The Stations of the Cross are painted and ready to install and the tabernacle remodel is in the works, with an opening cut in the back and a modified lining and new door under construction. The upholstery has been removed from our wooden chairs as we work to ready them for new upholstery, matching the cushions on the pews. I'm told that our pews may begin to return to the church this week. While no one wants to make a commitment yet, it looks to me like we may be on time for our late May completion. I can't wait.






CPR/AED TRAINING CLASSES






