### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Holy Week has begun. As we read the entire Passion of St. Matthew this weekend, we enter into the greatest mysteries of our faith. I encourage everyone to make this a Holy Week, with fasting, time for prayer, and reflection on the events in Jerusalem 2000 years ago.

The Church's greatest liturgies take place this week. The Chrism Mass will take place at the Fort Wayne Cathedral on Tuesday evening at 7:00 p.m. With our bishop, roughly 30 concelebrating priests, the Cathedral choir, trumpets and tympani, we will witness the blessing of new oils for the year. Priests will also renew their vows at this Mass.

Thursday evening begins the Sacred Triduum. Our Holy Thursday Mass, including the washing of feet and a Eucharistic procession will begin at 7:00 p.m. The Blessed Sacrament will remain in the chapel until 11:00 p.m., and then the tabernacle will be empty until Easter. We encourage people to sign up for our Paschal Watch, with people in quiet prayer in the church day and night waiting until the Easter Vigil begins and we hear the Good News of Resurrection.


Our Good Friday liturgy begins at 12:30 p.m. with the reading of the Passion of St. John. After a series of solemn petitions, we will venerate the cross, receive Holy Communion, and leave in silence.

At 3:00 p.m. on Good Friday, a Spanish-speaking group from St. Patrick's Parish will present a dramatic presentation of the Stations of the Cross. With a moderator providing commentary in English, it will be a presentation of high drama.

The Great Easter Vigil Mass begins on Saturday evening at 9:00 p.m. Beginning with the blessing of an Easter fire and our new Easter candle, we will hear the story of the empty tomb. Four adults will then be baptized and the congregation will be sprinkled with baptismal water. We will sing our great Easter Alleluias as we celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord.

Our Easter Masses will be celebrated at our normal Sunday times: 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m.

Please note the many times available for confessions this week, and please invite family, friends, and neighbors to join us for our liturgies this week. We love to see an overflowing church, and we would especially love to welcome those who aren't regulars. This year will be an especially joyful Easter with the liturgies for the first time in our newly-renovated church.



### **Paschal Watch**

St. Charles is again going to celebrate the Paschal Watch. The Church will remain open from after the Holy Thursday Mass until before the Holy Saturday Mass. Just as Jesus asked the apostles in the Scriptures "can you not watch one hour with me," He is now asking each of us the same questions.



A Plenary Indulgence removes all temporal punishment due to forgiven sin ("Temporal punishment" is the "making up" for sin to which we are obliged after we are forgiven). A Plenary Indulgence can be applied to one's self or to anyone who is deceased. A Plenary Indulgence can be gained once per day.
