A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

Next week is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. We will distribute palms at all Masses, and we hope to have our palm procession begin outdoors at the 11:00 a.m. Mass if the weather cooperates. The outdoor procession will begin at 11:00 a.m. in the grassy area near the gym door.

As we are reminded often during Lent, it is our responsibility to give alms, sharing our gifts with those in need. Tithing is a beautiful way of looking at our own gifts and giving away a percentage. Our parish is financially stable and as a parish we also have an obligation to share. Looking at the coming year's budget, we are planning to raise our tithe a bit, amounting to 7.5% of our offertory. We will help local people in need through our St. Vincent de Paul Society and also give help to four local parishes who struggle financially. We have added to our list this year the Rescue Mission, which serves the homeless in Fort Wayne. Remembering that St. Charles is the patron saint of seminaries, we are sending regular gifts to a seminary in Fort Portal, Uganda and we are helping with tuition costs for our own diocesan seminarians. 




