

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

We welcome guests and relatives who join us for our great celebration of Easter. This is the greatest feast of the Church and we are glad to have you with us. If anyone is looking for a church family, please check out our parish website, stcharlesfortwayne.org or give us a call at 260-482-2186. For those

who are not Catholic, we have programs both for adults and for children in which a person can learn more about the Catholic faith and join us if the Lord is calling. We are an active parish and we would love to have you join us.

We congratulate Olivia Hopkins, our newly-baptized Catholic, and we offer thanks to our catechetical team, our musicians, our decorators, our sacristans, our liturgical ministers, our livestream coordinators, and all who have helped to make our Holy Week liturgies beautiful. We are especially grateful to the Knights of Columbus; since December, the Knights have been setting up chairs in the gym every Saturday afternoon and taking them down every Sunday evening. God is present and our liturgies have been beautiful in the gym. I think, though, that we are all anxious to return to our church. It won't be much longer.

Next weekend is **Divine Mercy Sunday**. It is a time when we focus on the great mercy of our Lord, mercy which culminates in the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus offered to save us from sin and death. A plenary indulgence is offered to those who go to Communion on Mercy Sunday loving God and detesting sin, who go to confession within 20 days of that Sunday, and who offer an Our Father and a Hail Mary for the Pope's intentions.

Renovation, Week 14. We now have sixteen angels in the cupola above the altar. Our photo this week shows the installation. The angels are original oil paintings on canvas, painted by Gwyneth Thompson-Briggs, an artist from St. Louis. They were installed by Stacy Bolson, a wallpaper specialist from Iowa. The angels are painted in the style of the carvings on an ancient Greek building in Athens called the Tower of the Winds. These angels are holding objects which depict the rank of angels to which they belong. When the renovation is complete, we will print a brochure to explain all of the symbolism. The projected completion date is late May and I'm guessing that we are pretty much on schedule. We will plan a celebration when we return to our church home.

The St. Charles Council of St. Vincent dePaul Society will meet on Monday, April 18, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. in the Hession Center, Room B. Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. If this is something that is important to you, please plan to attend our next meeting to find out how you can lend a hand.

During the month of March we were able to help 59 individuals consisting of 34 adults and 25 children. We provided \$2,607 in rent and motel stays, \$764.14 in utility payments, \$240 in cards for gas and food, \$200 for furniture, and \$171 for food which provided 900 pounds of food. In addition, we give \$200 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help an immigrant family, for a total of \$4,182.14 to help the needy.





It remains important for our Church to protect children and young persons from the evils of abuse. DIVINE MERCY IS FOR YOU

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated annually on the first Sunday after Easter. A Plenary Indulgence removes all temporal punishment due to forgiven sin ("Temporal punishment" is the "making up" for sin to which we are obliged after we are forgiven). A Plenary Indulgence can be applied to one's self or to anyone who is deceased. A Plenary Indulgence can be gained once per day.


Prayers for the Pope's Intentions


