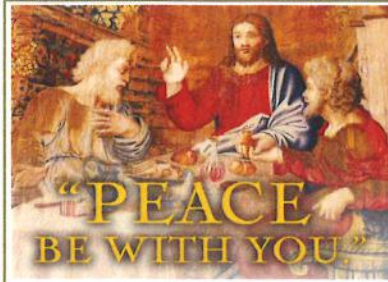

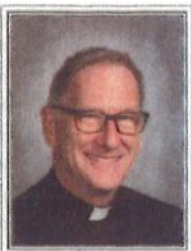

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

As our bulletin deadline is here, we have received the news of the death of Pope Francis. We offer prayers that he will know the beauty of eternal life, and we pray also for the Church. As we prepare for a conclave, may God guide us in the way of Christ and help us to ever better share the Good News of the Risen Christ with others.

We look back with excitement and joy to our Holy Week liturgies. Crowds were bigger this year than in the past, the music was wonderful, and we are thrilled by the number of baptisms. We continue singing our Easter Alleluias along with all of creation. Jesus has conquered sin and death. There is no greater news.

I offer thanks to our musicians, our church decorators, our maintenance crew, our catechists, and our liturgical ministers for all of the work involved in preparing for our solemn liturgies. I offer thanks to Fr. James and Fr. Bobby. Priests spend long hours during Lent hearing confessions in our parish as well as schools and parishes around town. We are also very grateful to Sam Martinez and Noah Isch, our parish seminarians, for all of their work in organizing liturgies and helping the servers. Sam and Noah will both be ordained deacons on May 24.

One more note of thanks: a huge thank you is due to all who contributed to our Lenten almsgiving project. As I am writing this column, we have received over \$30,000 to help build wells in Africa. I am overwhelmed by the generosity of this parish. When I reported this to the representative at Cross Catholic Outreach, her response was: "That is AMAZING!!!! What a wonderful blessing this will be!"

This Sunday is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a time to remember that the love and mercy of God has brought us here. God loves us despite our sin and is eager to wipe away that sin. We will offer prayers for the Holy Father at Masses this weekend. For those who receive Communion at Mass without attachment to sin and take part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 20 days, a plenary indulgence is offered on Mercy Sunday.

Our First Communion Mass will be next Sunday, May 4, at 1:00 p.m.. Please pray for our youngsters who will receive the Lord for the first time in Holy Communion.

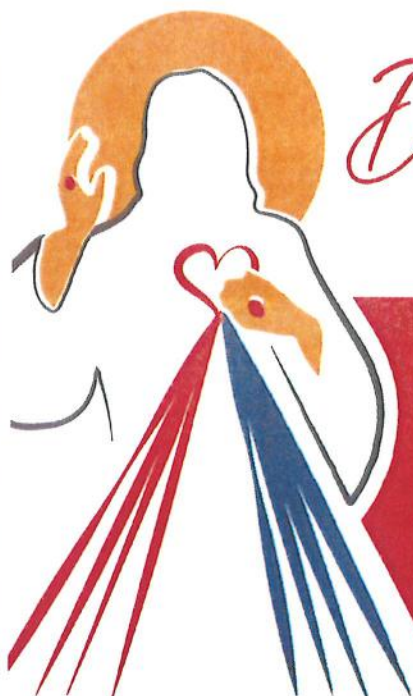

MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESE FORT WAYNE—SOUTH BEND

It remains important for our church to protect children and young persons from the evils of abuse. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend remains committed to upholding and following its guidelines, policies and procedures that were implemented for the protection of children and young people. These can be reviewed on the diocese's website, www.diocesefwsb.org, under "Young Protection."

If you have reason to believe that a minor may be a victim of child abuse or neglect, Indiana law requires that you report this to civil authorities. If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities of that abuse. In addition, if alleged abuser is or was a priest or deacon of the Catholic Church, you are encouraged to contact Jodi Marlin, Victim Assistance Coordinator, at (260) 399-1447, or jmarlin@diocesefwsb.org; or Rev. Mark Gurtner, Vicar General of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, at P.O. Box 390, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46801; at (260) 399-1419; or at mgurtner@diocesefwsb.org. The diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.

DIVINE MERCY IS FOR YOU

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated annually on the first Sunday after Easter. A Plenary Indulgence removes all temporal punishment due to forgiven sin ("Temporal punishment" is the "making up" for sin to which we are obliged after we are forgiven). A Plenary Indulgence can be applied to one's self or to anyone who is deceased. A Plenary Indulgence can be gained once per day.

In any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy.

OR

In the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!").
