

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

Very exciting news: Bishop Rhoades is available to join us for a dedication Mass of our Church on May 31, at 7:00 p.m. While this isn't yet a sure thing, as I write this column, our builders are cautiously optimistic that we will be ready to move back in by then. Mark your calendars and say a

prayer. More details will follow.

I offer my reflections after finishing Holy Week in the gym. I found our liturgies to be beautiful, our prayerful attitude to be unhampered, and our spirits strong. I am also very edified to find so many people willing to help with all the work in setting things up, moving furniture, and figuring out how to make a gym into a beautiful place of worship. I think that our Holy Week was a great

I am also very edified by the number of people in this parish coming for confessions. I have priest friends in other parts of the country who tell me that they hear very few confessions. We had fourteen hours of confessions scheduled during Holy Week, and we kept two priests busy during most of that time. This is a parish that understands our need for God's mercy. That is beautiful.

On the topic of mercy, this is Divine Mercy Sunday. A plenary indulgence is offered to those who receive Communion today, offering an Our Father and Hail Mary for the pope's intention, and going to confession within 20 days with detachment from sin. We remember a Lord who loves us despite our sin and who want nothing more than for us to accept His offer of mercy and live with Him forever.

We have an exciting event coming up on April 25. There is an ancient tradition of having a procession on April 25, called the Greater Litanies. We know that St. Charles Borromeo organized such processions and carried relics through the streets of Milan on that date. This year, April 25, happens to be the Monday before our parish First Communion. With Bishop Rhoades' approval, we are organizing a Eucharistic procession during the school day and we will march with our second grade. We will begin with a 1:15 p.m. school Mass, and then process around the campus, carrying relics, using Ethiopian processional umbrellas, ringing bells, reciting litanies, and finally carrying the Blessed Sacrament under a canopy, with the second graders throwing flower petals toward the Blessed Sacrament. The rest of the school will be outside to take part, either singing or reciting litanies. We invite parents and friends to join us.

Renovation, Week 15. We now have a beautiful marble wall behind the altar and workers are ready to begin installation of the tabernacle. The pews are back in the church and most of them are attached to the floor. The majority of the new pew cushions have been delivered and light fixtures are being installed in the cupola, above the altar. Things are rapidly taking shape. A large painting of St. Charles will hang to the right of the sanctuary, and I include a photo today with a close up of his face. Many portraits exist of St. Charles, so we know what he looked like. Our artist, who hires live models to pose as she paints, found a young Italian man from her parish in St. Louis to pose. I think it is a great resemblance.






