



#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

A great parish celebration will take place this **Tuesday evening, May 31, at 7:00 p.m.**After five months of exile, we return to our beloved church. Bishop Rhoades and many of our former St. Charles Priests will join us as we celebrate Mass in the church and the Bishop blesses the new renovation. After

Mass, we will offer mini tours, with an ice cream social outside. Please join us and invite friends. We would love to have an overflow crowd for this historic event.

Next weekend, a Priesthood Ordination will take place here in Fort Wayne. Everyone is welcome to join us at the Cathedral on Saturday, June 4, at 11:00. LeeAllen Fortin, our seminarian last summer, will be ordained a Priest along with two other young men who are dedicating their lives to serving in this diocese. We give thanks to God.

Next weekend, too, we will have a first-time opportunity here at St. Charles, *Pause and Praise*. Between the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses, we have talented musicians who will lead praise music in the gym. You may want to stay after the 9:00 a.m. Mass or come early before the 11:00 a.m. Mass for a half hour of praise music. On Pentecost Sunday, this is a perfect way to call on the Holy Spirit.

As we are nearly back in church and our tabernacle will be present in the church, I offer some words about genuflections and bows. One of the blessings of our renovation is that we can eliminate the confusion concerning genuflections and bows.

The basic norms: Outside of Mass, when walking past the tabernacle, a person should genuflect. Facing the tabernacle, we pause and touch the right knee to the floor. This is an act of adoration before Jesus, present within the tabernacle in the Blessed Sacrament. (Of course, for those with bad knees or bad balance, a reverent bow is a perfectly fine substitution for a genuflection.) Now that the tabernacle is clearly present in our sanctuary, when we enter the church we should genuflect before entering the pew. When leaving the pew after Mass, we also genuflect toward the tabernacle before turning toward the door.


The liturgical processions at the beginning and end of Mass follow the same norms. When the tabernacle is in the sanctuary, servers and clergy in procession should genuflect as they enter the sanctuary in the opening procession. They also genuflect when leaving the sanctuary in the final procession, before turning toward the door. Those who are carrying a cross, candle, book, or other liturgical item in procession bow rather than genuflect.

The instructions *during* the Mass, however, are different. During the Mass, our focus shifts from the tabernacle to the altar. The altar is the place where the saving sacrifice of Christ is made present and that is now our focus. Once the priest has led the Sign of the Cross and Mass has begun, anyone entering the sanctuary or walking in the area does not genuflect toward the tabernacle, but instead bows to the altar. During the Mass, the only time a person genuflects toward the tabernacle is when a deacon or priest opens it before or after Communion. For those moving in the sanctuary during Mass, a bow to the altar is the proper sign of reverence rather than a genuflection toward the tabernacle.

Renovation, Week 20. We are in the final week. As I write this column, the sound system is not yet functional, the lighting is being adjusted, we are awaiting carpet for the cry room and the reconciliation rooms, the pipe organ has not yet been reassembled, and a layer of dust still covers every surface. Our hope is that most of this will be resolved by May 31.

The photograph today shows one of the four lamps which will hang above the altar, surrounding the crucifix with four burning candles. We had the lamps custom-made to match our architecture, and they are mounted on electric motors so that we can easily lower them to replace the candles. As I write this column, we have four lamps but only one red glass cylinder. We are anxiously awaiting the arrival of three more. Please join us on May 31!
