

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This should be a quiet week in the parish. Fr. Koehl is taking some vacation days, all of our seminarians are having a week at Lake Wawasee, and there is not much happening.... at least on the surface. In the school building, however, things are buzzing. Teachers, administrators, and maintenance crews are

getting everything ready. School begins on August 11 and the parish comes alive again. We look forward to having our students back.

As we look at pandemic protocols in the school, we are hopeful that we will be closer to normal this year than last. Anything can change as we get updates from the CDC and from the Superintendent of our Catholic Schools, but as of the time that I write this column, we expect that masks will be optional. There will be less screens on the desks and less sanitizing of surfaces than last year. We will still have to keep track of any student who contracts COVID and we will have to put into quarantine those who have been within six feet of that student for 15 minutes or more. Those who have been vaccinated, which includes most of our teachers, will not be required to quarantine. In order to minimize the number of people who would have to go into quarantine, we will repeat some of our practices from last year, keeping each student surrounded by same classmates all day. The idea is to surround each student with the same classmates in the classrooms, the cafeteria, the playground, and at school Masses. Since students will still have to spread out at school Masses, we don't expect that we will be able to gather yet for all-school Masses. Fortunately, we are now experienced at livestreaming the liturgy into classrooms. All of this is progress and we are in a much better place than this time last year. We hope and pray that the pandemic will soon be behind us and the source of many remember when" stories.

Austin Linn, a Boy Scout in our parish, has just completed an Eagle Scout project, working around the pond in our school courtyard. Organizing the project with his scout friends, he cleaned up the landscaping, power washed and stained the deck by the pond, and added some bird feeders. As I am writing this column, we now have bids from general contractors for the church renovation project. After a few clarifications, we need one last diocesan approval to get a goahead to begin the renovation after Christmas.


