A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This Thursday evening, Sept. 21, we will have a fascinating presentation on the modern papacy and the hierarchy in the Vatican. Join us Thursday at 7:00 p.m. in the Hession Center and invite a friend. The presenter is a St. Charles parishioner, Don Clemmer, who worked for several years for the US Bishops Conference in Washington.

You will remember that we were scheduled to have a missionary speaker in July, but he had a death in the family and was not able to be here. He will join us next weekend, Sept. 23 and 24. He represents the Mary, Mother of God Society, which helps with Catholic missions in Vladivostok and far eastern Russia.

Many Catholics come to Mass but never get around to registering in a parish. Whether you are registered or not, always, always you are welcome and we are blessed that you are here. However, I will offer a list of reasons to consider registering in a parish.

If there is a medical emergency, we can find contact information.

If there is a need for a funeral in the family, we offer a funeral luncheon for registered parishioners.

Anyone who wants to be married in the Catholic Church must be registered in this or another parish.

Those who are asked to be godparents or Confirmation sponsors must be active, registered parishioners in this or another parish.

If you lose your purse in the church, we have a phone number to find you.

If someone in the family wants to attend a Catholic high school or college, they are often eligible for a tuition discount if we can verify that they are active, registered parishioners.

Joining a parish is belonging to a family of faith.

It is easy to register. We have a simple form which you can pick up on the table in the back of church, on our parish website, or at our parish office. If at some point you move or switch parishes, it is an easy phone call or e-mail to let us know to change your registration.

This Friday, September 22, St Charles Borromeo and St Vincent De Paul, and two non-catholic churches will come together for a night of unified prayer and worship at the University of Saint Francis cohosted by Shema Culture. It will be a time of praise and worship where Christians come together as



brothers and sisters in Christ, and pursue the heart of Jesus together. As Pope John 23rd said, "What unites us is far greater than what divides us". So we invite you to join in the prayer for all Christians to be united as one as Jesus himself prayed for in the garden.

The St. Charles Council of St. Vincent dePaul Society will meet on Monday, September 18, at 7:00 p.m. in the Hession Center, Room B. Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the



naked. If this is something that is important to you, please plan to attend our next meeting to find out how you can lend a hand.

Our Stuff A Truck event last month was very successful. We were able to fill three trucks rather than just the two we planned on. A big thanks to everyone that took the time to bring their furniture, clothing, and other household items to the trucks. Your generosity will be beneficial to the SVdP Thrift Store. The profits they make from the sale of those items will come back to the parish SVdP Conferences so we can help more people in need.

August was an extremely busy month for us helping the needy in our community. During the month, we were able to help 205 individuals consisting of 90 adults and 115 children. We provided \$4,342 in rent and motel stays, \$2,226.35 in utility payments, \$750 in cards for gas and food, \$540 for furniture and household items and \$322 for food which provided 1695 pounds of food, \$1,251.77 for miscellaneous items. In addition, we give \$200 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help immigrant families. We spent a total of \$9,632 to help the needy.

One of the ways SVdP members try to thank you for your great generosity is to pray daily for your intentions. I want to remind you of the Intention Boxes. One is in the Gathering Space across from the Scrip Office. The other is in the North Entrance of the Church. Please remember to put your intentions in one of the boxes so we can pray for them.

Only through your generosity have we been able to help so many. We are very grateful for your continued support. Thank you.

Will I get the credit I've earned? Yes. The money you earn from purchasing SCRIP is yours. If you have been saving your credit statements for the future, we recommend that you sign and turn them in at your earliest convenience. You will also receive a final credit statement (for your purchases from June until closing) after SCRIP has closed down.

Will I get a new volunteer schedule? No new volunteer schedules will be distributed. The current schedule runs through the end of September. If you are scheduled to work this month, please show up for your scheduled time. For any new volunteers who signed up this year, we are sorry that we didn't get a chance to know you. Thank you for volunteering!

Will I still be able to purchase SCRIP online with the app? No. Once the physical part of our inventory is gone, we are also required by the Diocese to close the online portion as well. We will contact all our RaiseRight customers with a specific date when you will no longer be able to make online purchases. (RaiseRight will be having their bonus days on September 21-22, so stock up on all your reloadable and e-cards then!)

What if I have a SCRIP gift certificate? If you have a yellow, paper gift certificate from SCRIP, please use it as soon as possible. Treat this as cash and use it to pay for your order.




