

hours, or e-mail stcparishoffice@yahoo.com. At the time of payment, you will receive your training book which should be reviewed before your class and returned the night of the class.







OCTOBER MONTHLY EUCHARISTIC SAINT

St. Thérèse of Lisieux (the "Little Flower") lived from 1873 to 1897, dying at only 24 years of age. She entered the Carmelite order at the age of 15 and became Directress of Novices in 1895. Known for her "little way" to holiness, she was canonized in 1925 and is a Doctor of the Church. In her autobiography, St. Thérèse expresses her joy after receiving Holy Communion: "It was a totally heavenly happiness which words cannot express. Also, "The best means to reach perfection is through receiving Holy Communion frequently. And "Do you realize that Jesus is there in the tabernacle expressly for you for you alone? He burns with the desire to come into your heart. Her feast day was Oct 1.


