

## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

All of the Priests of the Diocese will be gathering at a conference center near Plymouth from Tuesday afternoon until Thursday afternoon this week for our Annual Continuing Education Days. There will be neither Mass nor Confessions in the parish from Tuesday afternoon, 10/14, until Thursday afternoon, 10/16. We will return in time for our Thursday evening Mass and confessions.

With no parish Mass on Wednesday, Deacon Rob will lead a Communion Service at 8:15 a.m. The daily Mass readings will be read, along with a reflection, and then Holy Communion will be offered to those who are present.

Our monthly Wednesday morning coffee and donuts will be offered in the Community Room this week after the Communion Service on 10/15.

As reported in a recent video in church, Bishop Rhoades has called for a Diocesan Synod in the fall of 2026. The Priests of our Diocese, in our days away this week, will be taking part in a "Priest Consultation" to help prepare for that synod. On February 22, we will have a similar "parish consultation" at St. Charles. Similar consultations are being organized in convents, colleges, jails, homeless centers and nursing facilities in the diocese. The goal is to have a wide variety of people praying and thinking about the questions: What is working well in the Catholic Church in our diocese...and where do we really need to focus more attention? The discussion questions for the Diocesan Synod in 2026 will be drawn from the insights people bring to these many consultations. Watch the bulletin for more information, and mark your calendar for the afternoon of February 22.

Next weekend, we will have a rite at the 9:00 a.m. Mass for adults who are preparing to join the Catholic Church. Those who have not yet been baptized will become *Catechumens*. Those who have been baptized in a different Christian faith tradition will be welcomed and officially recognized as *Candidates* for the other Sacraments in the Catholic Church.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Each year, on the second-to-last Sunday in October, Catholics around the globe celebrate World Mission Sunday, a time of prayer and giving to support the missionary work of the Church. On the weekend of October 18-19, every parish in every country in the world will take up a collection to fund the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which supports 1,124 mission territories in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Europe. These are regions where the Church is still young, growing, and often facing poverty, conflict, or persecution.

The theme of this year's collection is "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples." Pope Leo chose this theme in reference to the Jubilee Year of Hope. He reflected on its meaning in his letter for World Mission Day:

"Through his disciples, sent to all peoples and mystically accompanied by him, the Lord Jesus continues his ministry of hope for humanity. He still bends over all those who are poor, afflicted, despairing and oppressed, and pours 'upon their wounds the balm of consolation and the wine of hope' (*Preface "Jesus the Good Samaritan"*). Obedient to her Lord and Master, and in the same spirit of service, the Church, the community of Christ's missionary disciples, prolongs that mission, offering her life for all in the midst of the nations. While facing persecutions, tribulations and difficulties, as well as her own imperfections and failures due to the weakness of her members, the Church is constantly impelled by the love of Christ to persevere, in union with him, on her missionary journey and to hear, like him and with him, the plea of suffering humanity and, indeed, the groaning of every creature that awaits definitive redemption. This is the Church that the Lord always and for ever calls to follow in his footsteps: 'not a static Church, but a missionary Church that walks with her Lord through the streets of the world' (*Homily at the Concluding Mass of the Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops*, 27 October 2024)."

The funds raised in this collection foster the proclamation of the Gospel, the building of churches and schools and the provision of food and medical care in vulnerable communities. It is good to remember that the Church in the United States was once a mission territory and would never have grown as it did without the support of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Between 1822 and 1908, American dioceses received the equivalent of more than \$250 million in today's dollars to build parishes, schools, and seminaries. How beautiful it is that the Church in our country now has the opportunity to extend the same kind of financial support that was once bestowed upon us.

I would be grateful if you would keep the Church's missionary efforts in your daily prayers and give generously to this important collection, which serves the spiritual and material well-being of so many of our brothers and sisters throughout the world.


