SCRIP NEWS

SOLD OUT Our inventory is almost gone so we will not be having sales on the weekend in the Gathering Space or on Friday mornings in the Hession Center anymore. If you are willing to purchase (or donate) the gift cards on hand from our last couple retailers, please contact us. The SCRIP office will still be open in the parish office basement while we finish some final details. If you have credit statements, we recommend that you sign and turn them in to the SCRIP office at your earliest convenience. You will also receive one more credit statement in January for your purchases during the last half of 2023. As always, feel free to call 260-969-4027, or email scrip@scbfw.org with any questions you may have.

If you would like to purchase SCRIP from another church, there are other programs in the Fort Wayne area. We have been in contact with three SCRIP programs that have agreed to take on St. Charles customers: St. Jude (260-484-4611), St. Vincent (260-489-3537 x234 or scrip@saintv.org), and <u>St. Aloysius</u> (scrip@SaintAloysiusYoder.info). Each one offers a percentage back to the customer and you can get the money you have earned in a rebate check or apply it toward tuition. Please contact them directly to find out specific details.

Online customers: October 31 will be the last day to purchase e-cards or to add funds to reloadable cards. Starting in November, you will no longer be able to purchase through RaiseRight. However, you will still have access to your account and will still be able to see and use anything in your wallet. You can also switch to a different organization and then continue to purchase SCRIP online. You will need to have the program's code in order to do this. Sign-in at RaiseRight.com (not the app, but same login), select Account, then Settings, and choose a different organization. Contact one of the churches listed above to get their unique online code.

For September, 2023, total in-person sales were \$251,756.94 and RaiseRight online sales were \$14,080.00. This generated a total profit of \$12,310.95 which will be shared 50/50 with our SCRIP customers. Thank you for your tremendous support last month!


such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. If this is something that is important to you, please plan to attend our next meeting to find out how you can lend a hand.

On October 1, we held our annual Friends Of the Poor Walk/Run to raise funds to support the needy of our community. Through the generosity of this Parish and businesses within our community, we were able to raise over \$27,000 for the St. Charles Conference of SVdP. We are very grateful to everyone that contributed to and participated in this event. St. Charles was the number 1 conference in our District in the amount of money raised.

September was again an extremely busy month for us helping the needy in our community. During the month, we were able to help 172 individuals consisting of 89 adults and 83 children. We provided \$ 1,914 in rent and motel stays, \$ 4,164 in utility payments, \$ 275 in cards for gas and food, \$ 700 for furniture and household items and \$ 332.50 for food which provided 1750 pounds of food. In addition, we give \$ 200 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help immigrant families. We spent a total of \$7,784 to help the needy.

Only through your generosity have we been able to help so many. We are very grateful for your continued support.


