




#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

On Tuesday, we will have the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the church for adoration from 9:15 a.m. until we close with Benediction at 2:25 p.m. Each class in the school will spend time in quiet prayer in the church during that span, and parishioners are welcome to join us any time during the day.

We will have representatives of Divine Mercy Funeral Home and Catholic Cemetery at the Masses this weekend. This is a chance to ask questions, to pick up literature, and to find out more about funerals and cemetery services. The person who preplans his own funeral saves the family a lot of decisions and a lot of stress when the time does come. I have my plans together and a nice cemetery plot ready to go.

Next weekend, we will have a Rite of Welcome at the 9:00 a.m. Mass for those who are planning to join the Catholic Church at Easter. As we pray for those on the journey, we are reminded of the treasure we have in our Church.

I have just returned from a trip to Germany with three old seminary classmates. The main focus of our trip was the Passion Play in Oberammergau. This small town in Germany was spared when a plague passed through in 1634. Since that time, the townspeople have been producing a Passion Play every ten years. The play is performed in years ending with a zero, though this season was delayed two years because of the pandemic. The play is held in a covered outdoor theatre which seats around 4,000 people. Booking far in advance, I was thrilled to reserve seats in the very front row! The play began with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. 2 ½ hours later there was a break for dinner and enough time to buy a stocking cap and gloves for the chilly night. On returning, the second half lasted over 3 hours. The actors and musicians are all residents of the town, and the entire performance is in German. Those of us who don't speak German are given translation booklets to follow. It was a phenomenal experience...one that will return in 2030.

#### The St. Vincent DePaul Society

The St. Charles Council of St. Vincent dePaul Society will meet on <u>Monday, October 17,</u> at 7:00 p.m. in the <u>Hession Center, Room B.</u>. Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. If this is something that is important to you, please plan to attend our next meeting to find out how you can lend a hand.

During the month of September, we were able to help 142 individuals consisting of 61 adults and 81 children. We provided \$ 3,386.00 in rent and motel stays, \$,1,745.39 in utility payments, \$ 1,055 in cards for gas and food, \$ 1,992.79 for furniture and household items, and \$ 266 for food which provided 1400 pounds of food. In addition, we give \$ 200 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help an immigrant family. We spent a total of \$ 8,645.18 to help the needy.


