A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This Thursday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation. We remember that Mary was untouched by sin, and we ask for her prayers. It is also the patronal feast day of our diocese and of our nation. A vigil Mass will be held at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, and Masses on Thursday are 6:15 a.m., 8:15


a.m. and 6:30 p.m.

In past years, we have held mornings of reflection during Advent and Lent. This year, we are trying something different, an Advent Evening of Reflection. Join us in the church on Thursday, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, at 7:45 p.m. for a talk presented by Fr. Koehl and for quiet time of reflection before the Blessed Sacrament.

Early on Saturday morning, Fr. Koehl will celebrate a Mass called *Rorate Caeli*, a votive Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin. Following a medieval custom, this Mass is offered during Advent by candlelight in a dark church as the sun is rising. Our Mass will be offered *ad orientum*—with the priest at the altar facing the tabernacle rather than the people. For many centuries the priest faced in this direction, and many of us are old enough to remember that. The concept was that priest and people are together facing God's throne. When the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council took place, there was a stress on other ancient liturgical practices, with the priest and people gathered around the Eucharistic table.

Please remember in prayer the young parishioners who will gather on Saturday morning to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. We have roughly 90 children who will confess their sin, receive the great gift of Absolution, and go forth in holiness. What a great gift we have in this Sacrament! I can't imagine going through life without it.

Next weekend will also be our annual collection to help with the needs of Retired Religious. Sister Genevieve will offer a few words about that collection While Sister Genevieve is not retired-and we hope that she won't be for many years-- she can give us insights into the needs of aging religious communities.

This Week in RCIA

December 6

This week in RCIA, we will take a look at the different parts of the Holy Mass to see what spiritual realities are happening during each. This is a continuation of our study of the Mass that began last week. Why do we start with a penitential rite and follow it with the singing of the Gloria? Why do we recite the Creed only on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation? What is up with all the standing, sitting and kneeling? Is this just Catholic calisthenics or is there a purpose to it all? Please pray for our catechumens and candidates, Bill, Joseph, Chris, Amy, Josh, Madison, Stephanie, Seth, Lyndsey and Joshua as they continue their journey in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

"Hail Mary, Full of Grace". For thousands of years, millions of times per day the Virgin Mary is greeted by the faithful with the greeting of the Archangel. The sons of the Church learn from the words of the Archangel Gabriel that the fullness of the mystery of God's grace was realized in Holy Mary. St. Paul the Apostle teaches us that the Father made all fullness dwell in His Incarnate Son (c.f. Col 1:12-20), which overflows from Christ's head and spills out on His Mystical Body that is the Church. Before descending in Body, Christ's fullness was spread in a unique and unrepeatable way on Mary, predestined from eternity to be the Mother of God.






