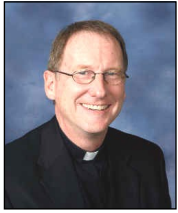

**A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR**



Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. This needs to be for us a time of prayer and reflection. It is also a wonderful time for charity, for disciplined self-sacrifice, and for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

On Palm Sunday, Mass begins with an opening Gospel and blessing of palms. That takes place from the back of church at most Masses. Assuming it doesn't rain, we will do this outdoors at the 11:00 a.m. Mass, with a solemn procession into the church. In order to ensure a safe gathering and procession, we will ask everyone to wear masks outdoors and to maintain distance.

As announced last week, we now have our Sunday Mass music posted on our parish website, [stcharlesfortwayne.org](http://stcharlesfortwayne.org). At the very top of the homepage, there is an orange bar you can click for Mass music. You will then be asked to choose which Mass you will attend. You are welcome to use a smart phone during Mass if you would like to sing the hymns; some may find it easier to print the music in advance and bring it to Mass. This, of course, is a temporary adaptation. I would hope that we will be able to put our hymnals back in the pews soon and put the phones away.

We normally have a Lenten penance service and invite many priests to help with confessions after the service. Like most local parishes, we are not going to have a penance service this year. Instead, we are adding extra confession times. This Wednesday evening, March 24, we will have all three priests available for confessions from 7:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. Come to the Gathering Space and you will see chairs and signs directing you.

You will find in the bulletin a full schedule of Holy Week liturgies, with many, many opportunities for confessions in the coming two weeks. As we are watching our Mass attendance grow, we will be prepared for a simultaneous liturgy in the gym on Good Friday and also for the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses on Easter morning. We can all remember last year when there was no public celebration of any Holy Week liturgies. This will be our year for Alleluias.

**"This Week in RCIA"**

March 21 to the Easter Vigil

The elect and the candidates have now entered the season of Lent. For them, it is the period known as Purification and Enlightenment. This

is a time marked with more intense spiritual preparation for the reception of the Sacraments. They will participate in different reflections and rites. It is a period for looking inward at self, turning away from sin and learning to trust in God's mercy. The elect participate in three rites known as the Scrutinies and the candidates participate in the Penitential Rite. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is sinful in the hearts of the elect and strengthen all that is upright and good. Similarly, the Penitential Rite for the candidates gives them a chance to re-strengthen their faith commitment that they have already made as baptized individuals. Please pray for our catechumens and candidates, Casey, Jacob, Graham, Brian, Todd, Natali, Caleb and Jessica as they continue their journey in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.
