A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend marks Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. This is the time of our most sacred liturgy. We all need to be sure that this is a time of prayer. The Sacred Triduum, the Church's greatest prayer begins at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday evening, with the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the washing of feet. We continue on Good Friday, with the Lord's Passion celebrated at 12:30 p.m. The solemn Easter Vigil Mass will

begin at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday night. We will bless our Easter fire and Easter candle, we will read the story of salvation, and we will baptize and Confirm those who have been preparing to join the Church. The Easter Vigil Mass will last two hours and is the highlight of the year in the Catholic Church. The Triduum concludes with Easter Sunday Masses, on a familiar schedule: 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m.

In addition to the major liturgies, we have many opportunities this week for daily Masses, confessions, and Stations of the Cross. We will also have the church open for quiet prayer from Thursday evening until Saturday night.

Even as we maintain social distance, we would love to have visitors and quests join us this week. We will be prepared for overflow crowds on Good Friday and at the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses on Easter morning, with simultaneous liturgies ready in the gym. Please let friends from other parishes know that we have an evening Mass on Easter Sunday. For those who work in hospitals or other service jobs and cannot come to Mass during the morning, the Easter Mass is still available.

Our bishops have had a thankless job during this pandemic, trying to lead the faithful while judging how best to protect our vulnerable parishioners. The latest directives from our diocese allow us to use hymnals and holy water once again. If you would like to see our bishop's directives, including his list of medical advisors, go to the diocesan website, diocesefwsb.org, and click on Response to Covid 19. The Vatican has also released a packet of information about COVID vaccines. This can be found on our parish website, stcharlesfortwayne.org. Look under Business Office. We didn't know where else to attach it!

Copies are available in the back of church of the Divine Mercy novena, which begins on Good Friday. A plenary indulgence is offered on Mercy Sunday, the week after Easter, for those who receive Holy Communion with a complete detachment from sin, Pray for the Pope's Intention, and have a Sacramental Confession within twenty days. More information is found on our parish website under Events.

We turn now to the Passion of our Lord. We enter into our most profound time of prayer. As the Lord has offered himself for us, we raise our hearts in prayer.

"This Week in RCIA"

March 28 to the Easter Vigil The elect and the candidates have A JOURNEY IN FAITH now entered the season of Lent. For them, it is the period known as Purification and Enlightenment. This

is a time marked with more intense spiritual preparation for the reception of the Sacraments. They will participate in different reflections and rites. It is a period for looking inward at self, turning away from sin and learning to trust in God's mercy. The elect participate in three rites known as the Scrutinies and the candidates participate in the Penitential Rite. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is sinful in the hearts of the elect and strengthen all that is upright and good. Similarly, the Penitential Rite for the candidates gives them a chance to restrengthen their faith commitment that they have already made as baptized individuals. Please pray for our catechumens and candidates, Casey, Jacob, Graham, Brian, Todd, Natali, Caleb and Jessica as they continue their journey in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.






