



FISH FRY 2025

Preparation for a parish fish fry doesn't start the day of the big event. Weeks before, Sean Digan, project manager, turned the knight's office into a warehouse with plates, containers, serving ware and all sorts of nonperishable items. The week of the event freezer space became a premium at the school, Sean's house and any place that could be found. Thursday night, a team prepped 700 serving cups with applesauce and tartar sauce for carryout. Noon on Friday, a dozen Knights breaded 350 – 400 pounds of haddock in the Dan's Fish Fry mobile unit. Once the school cafeteria staff cleared, another team began work in the kitchen and the carryout room. All this work was performed smoothly with oversight from our kitchen supervisors, Gene Delaney and Tim Isch, while Joe Mikolay organized the carry-out area. In all, there were roughly 90 positions that had to be filled by Knights, their wives and many other volunteers.

How, might you ask, do you measure the success of the event? How about serving more than 750 dinners, or a cafeteria filled to near capacity for two hours by crowds enjoying a good meal and socializing with family and friends. Perhaps more importantly, most of this money will be used by the Knights for charitable contributions and in financing many activities. Fourth Degree Exemplification

On March 22, 2025, the Fourth Degree Exemplification for the Midwest was held in Indianapolis. Those in attendance were Bishop Robert J. McClory, Gary Diocese; Bishop Timothy Doherty, Lafayette Diocese; Archbishop Charles Thompson, Indianapolis; Supreme Master, Michael McCusker, PSD, with many other dignitaries and 110 candidates. The event was of particular significance in that this year marked the 125th anniversary of the establishment of the patriotic order. The first exemplification took place Feb. 22, 1900, in New York City when 1,100 Knights received the Fourth Degree.

Of note, the first Fourth Degree Ceremony in Indiana was held in the Diocese of Fort Wayne in 1914. Continuing this tradition of patriotic service on March 22 were several candidates from Fort Wayne including one of our own from 451, Dennis Redding. Dennis joins many other brother knights from our council as a member of the Anthony Wayne Assembly Fourth Degree.

Following the exemplification ceremony, a banquet was held at the Knights of Columbus hall at the Cathedral downtown. The evening's program included messages from several of the visiting dignitaries and presentation of awards. As part of the awards ceremony, one honoree was recognized from each diocese. The honoree from the Fort Wayne-South Bend Diocese was Steve Lutz from Council 451. Steve is the past Indiana Veterans Affairs Chairman. He was recognized for his leadership and continued involvement in this committee as they serve our veterans.

During the day, a first-class relic of Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney was present in the Blessed Chapel. Knights could approach and touch appropriate items to the relic creating third class relics. This was indeed a great honor and a visit to remember as we continue to pray for his canonization to sainthood.




