Utilizing the expertise of the Plant Center, Inc. the proposal included new landscaping for the north and south sides of the school along with additional shrubbery on the southwest corner of the church. In all, nearly 80 trees, shrubs and plants were added. The Plant Center handled the planting of the 20 trees and larger shrubs with their heavier equipment. The Knights with a team of 23 tackled the remaining 60 smaller plants chiseling through the dry clay and spreading some 10 yards of mulch.
